Consultancy: Analysis of Survey Data from Frontline Welfare Providers Period: February- June 2021

ORGANISATIONAL CONTEXT

ECPAT International is a global network of organisations working together for the elimination of the sexual exploitation of children. It currently consists of 122 members working at national and local levels in 104 countries. The ECPAT International Secretariat is based in Bangkok, Thailand and provides services like technical support and information, coordination of multi-national projects, and holds workshops and other educational forums to extend and exchange knowledge among members in different countries. It also conducts and coordinates research and represents and advocates on key issues at the international level on behalf of the network.

POSITION DETAILS

The ECPAT International research department is currently managing two research projects which include data collection via surveys of frontline welfare workers in 15 countries via our members.

LOT 1: GLOBAL BOYS INITIATIVE (9 X 100 CASE DATA-SETS)

ECPAT International is coordinating a multi-stakeholder Global Boys' Initiative to explore the sexual exploitation of boys. The initiative includes data collection from surveys with up to 100 frontline workers in each of 9 countries that explores the access to, and quality and effectiveness, of welfare support services regarding sexual exploitation and abuse that are available to boys. This tool includes both quantitative items (mostly multiple choice, some numeric data) and qualitative items (short answer items).

LOT 2: VOICES OF SURVIVORS PROJECT (6X 100 CASE DATA-SETS)

ECPAT International has entered into a partnership with the WePROTECT Global Alliance to conduct important research that puts the voices of survivors of online child sexual exploitation at the forefront of the response to this problem. The project will be implemented in three countries in Latin America and three in Eastern Europe. Data collection from surveys with up to 100 frontline workers will be conducted in each of 6 countries to measure the quality and effectiveness of welfare support services for survivors of online child sexual exploitation and abuse. This tool includes both quantitative items (mostly multiple choice, some numeric data) and qualitative items (short answer items).

KEY AREAS OF RESPONSIBILITY

For each lot applied for, the Consultant will collaborate with the ECPAT Research Team to:

1. Design an analysis plan based on the survey used for data collection. This plan will be approved by ECPAT Research Team.
2. Complete initial cleaning of raw data sets. (ECPAT will coordinate translation of qualitative data to English prior to sharing raw data sets).
3. Liaise with ECPAT Research Team and in some cases directly with member organisations to clarify issues that arise in cleaning, with translation of qualitative data.



4. Conduct data analysis for each country data set.
5. Generate a draft report for each country data set.
6. Accommodate one round of feedback on each draft report from the ECPAT Research Team.

TIMEFRAME

Lot 1: 50 days work (5 days preparation, approximately 5 days per country, including analysis, report writing and accommodating feedback)

Lot 2: 40 days work (10 days preparation, approximately 5 days per country, including analysis, report writing and accommodating feedback)

MANAGEMENT AND REPORTING ARRANGEMENTS

The Consultant will report to the Head of Research and Policy of ECPAT International, Mark Kavenagh but will also work closely with the project leads for the Global Boys Initiative and the Voices of Survivors Project.

- This is a home-based position; the consultant will work from home but should be available online during hours agreed with the Head of Research, and for Lot 1 be available for communication with different time zones.
